The UNAIDS Technical Support Mechanism, managed by Oxford Policy Management (OPM), supported by Genesis Analytics (Genesis) is expanding the pool of consultants available to support Global Fund new funding requests in the 2023-2025 Funding Cycle.

We aim to expand the consultant pool by inviting consultants to attend online (virtual) capacity-strengthening workshops.

The Global Fund recently launched <u>updated guidance</u> to support country applications for the 2023-2025 allocation period. Two regional workshops to strengthen consultants' capacities to support new funding requests in the 2023 will take place during October and December. These are:

- Workshop 1: Eastern and Southern Africa, to take place in Nairobi, Kenya, 17-21 October)
- Workshop 2: West and Central Africa, to take place in Saly, Senegal, 5-9
 December.

These in-person workshops will familiarise consultants with new materials and guidance. The workshops target primarily regional and national consultants in the two regions who are already experienced in supporting GF funding requests.

In addition, the UNAIDS TSM has made several spaces available online (or virtually) for consultants who are less familiar with Global Fund application processes. This is the opportunity we invite consultants to express interest in:

Key Responsibilities

• Attend the 5-day workshop online. You will be expected to arrange online access to listen in to / observe the workshops from your home location.

- **Be willing to engage in additional Q&A webinars** following the workshops to explore any questions and areas for further clarification.
- Be willing to take part in consultant teams supporting GF funding requests
 during 2023 and beyond. These assignments are likely to begin from January
 2023. The TSM cannot guarantee that you will be placed within a team but will
 do its best to support you in doing so. Should you be selected to take part in a
 consulting assignment, you would assume a paid role in a 'junior' capacity,
 aiming to apply your new knowledge and skills in a supported, expert
 environment.

Required skills and experience

- Willing to learn and be mentored by more experienced consultants.
- Have at least 5 years' working knowledge and experience of working in HIV and HIV-related programmes.
- Comfortable in team working situations.
- Able to travel for weeks at a time during the development of new funding requests.
- Be willing to work flexibly, in line with the often fast-changing and pressured environment.
- Be based in or have recent (within the last 3 years) working experience in the countries/regions that will be making a funding request.

Preferred skills and experience

- Ability to work in English as well as the national language in your country of residence.
- Prior consulting experience.
- Some prior knowledge of/ experience of the Global Fund is desirable but not essential
- Familiarity working with a range of clients including governments, communities, UN agencies, and other development partners.

Behavioural capabilities

- Mutual support Builds respectful relationships that support effective and collaborative working. Facilitates open discussions that create 'win-win' outcomes and helps others solve problems.
- **Accountability** Comfortable taking ownership, able to explain decisions and actions honestly, whilst supporting others' ideas and mistakes.
- Trust Demonstrates generosity and warmth, believes in others, giving credit where credit is due. Shares information openly, honestly and in a straightforward manner
